

Welcome to the 2025 Light Car and Edwardian Section Welsh Weekend, THE highlight of the vintage motoring year!

We will be returning, as is now customary, to The Metropole Hotel in Llandrindod Wells for the 2025 Welsh Weekend, this year to be a more relaxed event than that of 2024, offering a one day Scenic Tour on the Saturday and the chance to pt yourself and your car against the Welsh Scenery on the Sunday Trial

Saturday will see us taking to the roads for up to 100 mile Scenic Tour, leaving Llandrindod Wells, heading in a roughly North to North-North Easterly direction to a lunch halt in Montgomery. We will not be organising any formal lunch or catering and therefore suggest patronising one of the Town's Pubs or Cafes, or even packing a Picnic!

The Tour will be followed on the Saturday evening by the Section's legendary Annual Dinner and Awards at The Metropole Hotel in the heart of atmospheric Llandrindod Wells (please remember to book tickets direct with the hotel). On Sunday, we will be up early for the Trial, not forgetting that the Clocks go Forward, finishing in time for lunch and the results of the Trial before departing. All in all, an event not to be missed!

The minimum entry age for the Trial remains at 14 (The MSUK Limit) and must be accompanied by someone who is both experienced in the operation of the Vehicle and permitted to drive on the Public Highway between Sections. Entries for under 23s are being offered at a reduced price.

Touring Assembly Regulations

Announcement

The Light Car & Edwardian Section of the Vintage Sports Car Club Limited will organise a Certificate of Exemption Touring Assembly on Saturday 29th March 2025. The event will start and finish at the Metropole Hotel, Temple Street, Llandrindod Wells, Powys (MR 147/061611).

Jurisdiction

The meeting will be held under the National Competition Rules of Motorsport UK (including the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organising Club may issue for the event.

<u>Authorisation</u>

MSUK Certificate of Exemption (Saturday)

Eligibility

The event is open to all fully paid-up members of both the organising club and the Light Car & Edwardian Section, driving cars that are accepted by the Section.

Programme of the Meeting

Scrutineering will be available on Friday 28th April from around 3.00 p.m. at the Metropole. Scrutineering and Signing-on will then open at the Metropole at 8.30 a.m. on Saturday 29th April. Any competitor who has not passed Scrutineering and Signing-on by 10.00 a.m. on the relevant day may be excluded. Cars will leave the start from 9.00 a.m. and will complete the Touring Assembly route. Entrants are asked to return their completed declaration forms to the Event Office by 5.30pm

<u>Route</u>

The total route is up to 100 miles. Straightforward route instructions of the 'tulip' variety will be given along with a marked-up OS Landranger map. For those who wish to bring their own maps, the route is contained on Ordnance Survey Landranger 1:50,000 Maps 136 Newtown & Llanidloes & 137 Church Stretton & Ludlow. Various short cuts are available for the less ambitious vehicle and driver.

<u>Classes</u>

There will be no Classes in this event

Technical Regulations

All vehicles must comply with MSUK Technical Regulations and with the VSCC's 'Eligibility of Cars (Edition 6 2023) leaflet (or subsequent) and the requirements of the Light Car and Edwardian Section of the VSCC.

All competing cars must be taxed and insured for use on the public highway. Insurance cover must include usage on this type of event. It is the competitor's responsibility to present the car in a fully roadworthy condition and properly equipped to take part in this event.

The following MSUK Regulations apply:

NCR 6.1.1.1 (d) (ROADWORTHYNESS)

An entrant shall, before the event, satisfy themselves as to the eligibility and safety of the vehicle and safety equipment and the competence of its driver.

NCR 6.1.1.1 (e) (ROADWORTHYNESS)

An entrant shall furthermore ensure that a vehicle is maintained in an eligible and safe condition throughout the event or meeting.

We recommend that cars be equipped with a working fire extinguisher, which must be firmly secured (Halon/BCF is not allowed).

NCR 6.1.1.2 (ROADWORTHYNESS)

The act of presenting a vehicle and safety equipment for official scrutiny shall be deemed a declaration of its fitness and eligibility for the event and an acceptance of the consequences of such a declaration not being valid.

Competitive element

Driving Standards Observers may be appointed who will establish checks en-route and who will be Judges of Fact.

<u>Awards</u>

First, Second and Third class awards appropriate to the number of starters may be awarded. These will be based on non-motoring competitions. The results of the event will also count towards the Llwynbarried Trophy for the best overall performance across the Weekend (in combination with the Trial).

Entries

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and closes finally on Monday 10th March 2025 or whenever the entry is fully subscribed, whichever is sooner. The entry fee is £30



per car. If the driver is under 23 years old, the entry fee is £20 per car. Note that a discounted fee is available if the Trial is also entered – see the Entry Form for details.

Announcement

The Light Car & Edwardian Section of the Vintage Sports Car Club Limited will organise a Clubmans Car Trial permit event on Sunday 30th March 2025. The event will start from the Metropole Hotel, Temple Street, Llandrindod Wells, Powys (MR 147/061611). The finish location will be detailed in the Final Instructions.

Jurisdiction

The meeting will be held under the National Competition Rules of the Motor Sport UK (including the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organising Club may issue for the event.

<u>Eligibility</u>

The event is open to all fully paid-up members of both the organising club and the Light Car & Edwardian Section, driving cars that are accepted by the Section.

Programme of the Meeting

Scrutineering will be available on Friday 28th March from around 3.00 p.m. at the start/finish venue. Scrutineering and Signing-on will then open at the start/finish venue at 8.30 a.m. on Saturday 29th March and at 8.30 a.m. on Sunday 30th March. Any competitor who has not passed Scrutineering and Signing-on by 10.00 a.m. on Sunday may be excluded. The first hills will open at 9.00 a.m. Competitors who have not returned their Score Card to the finish by the published time may be excluded.

Route

Public roads will be used to link sections. There is no competitive mileage on any public right of way. The Route will be on Ordnance Survey Landranger 1:50,000 Map 147 Elan Valley and Builth Wells. A printed map will be provided. Details of the hill locations, any route to be followed, and any running order for the hills will be issued at Signing-on.

<u>Classes</u>

Class 1: Edwardian cars.

Class 2: Light cars with differentials.



Class 3: Light cars without differentials.

All competitors, Drivers, Navigators and Passengers need to have one of the Motorsport UK RS Clubman Competition Licences (unless you have a Race or Speed licence for 2025) these are free, mandatory and issued by our governing body. You can apply online at <u>https://www.motorsportuk.org/competitors/rs-clubman-licence/</u> and we recommend you and your passengers / navigators do so immediately. Navigators under the age of 18 in the rear seats do not require a licence, but must fill in a MSUK parental consent form. Technical Regulations

All vehicles must comply with MSUK Technical regulations and with the VSCC's 'Eligibility of Cars (Edition 6 2023)' leaflet (or subsequent) and the requirements of the Light Car and Edwardian Section of the VSCC.

In addition:

Well-based tyres on the driven wheels must have a tread pattern such that the blocks are not more than 10mm deep, nor more than 10mm apart laterally or circumferentially. There must not be an uninterrupted lateral gap between the side blocks. Off Road, Trail or Enduro tyres are not eligible.

Special grip, knobbly or hand cut tread tyres are not allowed. Note: Tyres with bolts or screws penetrating the side walls or beads are illegal and will not be allowed; neither will operational security bolts. Specifically, 3.50 × 19 INOUE tyres are not permitted.

All competing cars must be taxed and insured for use on the public highway. Insurance cover must include usage on this event

All cars must be equipped with a working fire extinguisher, a minimum of 1.75ltr AFFF in one or two bottles (Halon/BCF is not allowed) which must be firmly secured. All cars must carry a MSUK approved spill kit.

Competitors are reminded of the MSUK requirement for all children under the age of 12 years or 1.35m in height to be seated in an approved child restraint in the rear of the car.

For drivers without a full valid UK Driving Licence the front seat passenger must hold a full valid UK Driving Licence and drive between sections, and must sign to confirm that they are capable of controlling the car at all times both on and off of the sections.

Where the driver is under the age of 18 their entry form must be countersigned by a Parent with Legal responsibility for them to confirm that they give consent for the entry and that the front seat passenger is capable of controlling the car at all times.



<u>Awards</u>

Awards will be presented as follows:

Named trophies:

Winifred Boddy Memorial Trophy for the best performance by a competitor who has not previously won an award on the Sporting Trial;

Kate Hutchings Memorial Trophy for the best performance by a competitor aged under 23.

First, Second and Third class awards appropriate to the number of starters in each class.

Named trophies to be held for one year, others to be retained.

The results of the event will also count towards the Llwynbarried Trophy for the best overall performance across the Weekend (in combination with the Touring Assembly).

Entries

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and closes finally on Monday 10th March 2025 or when the event is fully subscribed, whichever is sooner. The entry fee is £30 per car. If the driver is under 23 years old, the entry fee is £20 per car. Note that a discounted fee is available if the Tour is also entered – see the Entry Form for details.

Identification

Competitors will be identified by numbers supplied by the organiser, to be displayed at the front of the vehicle. These must be removed at the finish or on retirement from the event.

Scoring

Competitors will be issued with a score card; it is the competitor's responsibility to see that the correct score is entered by the marshal at each observed section. It is also the competitor's responsibility to ensure that the score cards are returned to the results team by the time stipulated. Cards not received by this time may be excluded from the results. Marking and penalties will be as printed in the appropriate section of the MSUK National Competition Rules except as modified below:

NCR 17.2.5.4 (b, c, d) 10-20 marks will be given for each hill cleanly ascended and any such less marks for each portion of the hill as detailed by the marshal in charge who is appointed judge of fact.

The organisers reserve the right to include different start lines for cars in different Classes, or to have stop/restart tests, or to have route variations.

Two bonus marks per section will be awarded to cars equipped with beaded-edge tyres on all wheels, as declared on the Entry Form and verified at Scrutineering.

<u>Results</u>

Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the end of the event and in accordance with NCR 3.6.1.1 (c). Any appeal or protest must be lodged in accordance with NCR 2.4, 2.6 & 2.9.

Modification of the General Regulations

All other National Competition Rules of MSUK apply as written, except the below which have been modified:

A car may be driven by two drivers on the Car Trial, provided that a separate entry form is submitted for each driver, making it clear that the car is to be shared.

NCR 17.2.3 Numbers will be allocated by the organisers.

NCR 17.2.4 The start observed section will be published at Signing-on. The running order will be free subject to the requirements of the observed section instructions.

NCR 17.2.11.1 The crew must not change during the event. This will be strictly enforced. The only exception to this will be for drivers without a full UK Driving Licence where the nominated front seat passenger must drive between sections.



NCR 17.2.4.3 The only time schedule requirement is to be scrutineered and signed-on no later than 10.00 a.m., to attempt certain observed sections before the designated closing time and to hand in Score Cards by the designated time.

NCR 17.13.6 Ties will be resolved using the 'furthest cleanest' principle. The final decision will rest with the Clerk of the Course.

Drugs & Alcohol

In accordance with NCR 1.3 all entrants are reminded that they should abstain from the consumption of alcohol or drugs and that defaulter(s) may be excluded under NCR 2.2.1 (g).

Drones are not permitted at this event.
